Field Tour: Rouse Hill

Australia's largest community water recycling scheme

Thursday 7 April, 5:00pm Rouse Hill

Australia's largest residential water recycling scheme is in the Rouse Hill area in Sydney's north-west.

Over 19,000 homes are now using up to 1.7 billion litres of recycled water each year for flushing toilets, watering gardens, washing cars and other outdoor uses

On average the Rouse Hill scheme has reduced demand for drinking water by about 40%. Eventually the scheme will serve 36,000 homes.

The Rouse Hill Water Recycling Plant treats about 4.7 billion litres of wastewater each year for residential use. Ideas from Rouse Hill have flowed through to developments such as Green Square Town Centre and Oran Park, Barangaroo and Charlestown Square.
